Stanzin Spalzes Roll No.00123/SN	Staff Nurse	Request for re-checking of OMR sheet	As requested by the candidate, the OMR sheet was re-checked by the committee and the marks obtained by the candidate i.e. 50 marks for the 50 correct answers and 08 negative marks for 32 wrong answers net (50-8=42 marks) was found correct. The candidate was informed accordingly.
2.	Tsering Nurboo Roll No.0038/AC	Accountant/ Cashier	Request for re-checking of OMR Sheet	As requested by the candidate, the OMR Sheet was re-checked by the committee and the marks obtained by the candidate i.e. 38 marks for 38 correct answers and 10.25 negative marks for 41 wrong answers i.e. 38-10.25= Net 27.75 marks was found correct. The candidate was informed accordingly.
3.	Lodoe Choephel Roll No.00144/Ph	Pharmacist (Sowa Rigpa)	Request for re-checking of OMR Sheet	As requested by the candidate, the OMR Sheet was re-checked by the committee and the marks obtained by the candidate i.e. 46 marks for 46 correct answers and 5.50 negative marks for 22 wrong answers i.e. 46-5.50= Net 40.50 marks was found correct. The candidate was informed accordingly.
4.	Dolma Tsering Roll No.0063/UDC	UDC	Request for re-checking of OMR Sheet	As requested by the candidate, the OMR Sheet was re-checked by the committee and it was found that the candidate has given correct answers for Question No.34 & 36 but the evaluator has given negative marks for these two questions due to an oversight. Accordingly, the candidate has given 56 correct answers and 14 wrong answers which works out to net total of 52.50 marks but the evaluator has given 54 marks for 54 correct answers and 3.75 negative marks for 15 wrong answers which works out to a net marks of 50.25 marks. On the basis of above, the candidate as obtained a total of 52.50 marks.
5.	Dinesh Yadav Roll No.	Staff Nurse	Grievances regarding process of question paper and complaint of cheating.	The question papers for the written test were prepared by a duly constituted committee comprising representatives from the Ministry of Ayush, New Delhi, Members from Defence Institute of High Altitude Research (DIHAR) (DRDO), Leh and Central Institute of Buddhist Studies Deemed to be University), Choglamsar, Leh on the same day of the written test. The question papers were printed only after the candidates were seated in the exam hall and distributed to the candidates on the spot. The answer keys were prepared only after submission of OMR Sheets by all the candidates, hence the entire process of question paper setting was completely transparent and the question of cheating does not arise at all. The OMR Sheets were duly signed by the Invigilator after submission of OMR sheets by the candidates and not in the blank OMR Sheets. Thus, the candidate was informed accordingly.

6.	Pintu Singh	Junior Hindi Translator	Request for re-checking of OMR Sheet And objection on Question No.20,43,61 and 64.	As requested by the candidate, the OMR sheet was re-checked by the committee and it was found that the candidate has attempted a total of 99 questions out of which 55 answers were correct and the remaining 44 answers were wrong. Accordingly the candidate has scored 55 marks for 55 correct answers and 11 negative marks for the 44 wrong answers. The net marks obtained by the candidate is $55-11=44$ marks. The question No.20,43,61 & 64 for which the candidate has raised objection were also checked by the experts and the questions were found in order. Similar questions have also appeared in previous SSC exams. The candidate was informed accordingly.
7.			Request for reducing the minimum qualifying marks	Considering the grievances of most of the candidates, the selection Committee re-considered the matter and recommended to the competent authority to reduce the minimum qualifying marks from 50% to 40% for the written test for all the posts. The competent authority i.e. Chairman of the selection Committee accepted the recommendation of the selection committee and accordingly the marks were calculated and the short list issued on the basis of the revised minimum qualifying marks of 40% for all the posts.
8.	Jigmet Youdol	UDC	The candidate has complained that one of the invigilator was helping a particular candidate seated adjacent to her during the written test.	The candidate has sent her grievances on 11.01.2024 i.e. after 09 days of the written test. If the candidate had any such complaint then she should have reported the matter to the concerned authorities on the spot during the written test. Moreover, candidates were given time upto 08.01.2024 to send their grievances, if any. Making such grievances after the lapse of such a long time has no validity. Moreover, all the invigilators on duty during the written test have totally denied the charges.
